ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

1. Records to be kept.
2. Penalty.
3. Entry on premises and inspection of records.
4. Commencement.

(Made on the 24th January, 1951.)

The Acquisition of Non-ferrous Metal (Records of Metal Dealers) Ordinance, 1951

THE STATES, on the representations of the Island Police Committee, hereby order: –

Records to be kept.

1. Every person carrying on business as a dealer in old metal shall correctly enter in a book to be kept by him for that purpose the description, weight and price of every quantity in excess of one pound avoirdupois of non-ferrous metal purchased or otherwise acquired by him, and the name, address and occupation of the person from whom the same were purchased or otherwise acquired, and the date of the transaction to which the entry relates. The person from whom such metal has been acquired shall sign his name at the foot or end of such entry.

Penalty.

2. Every person failing to comply with the requirements of the last preceding section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding [level 1 on the uniform scale].

NOTE

In section 2, the words in square brackets were substituted by the Uniform Scale of Fines (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1989, section 2(2), with effect from 1st July, 1989.

Entry on premises and inspection of records.

3. Any member of the Island Police Force duly authorised in writing in

that behalf by the Chief Officer, and if so required exhibiting his authority shall have free access at all reasonable times to the place of business, warehouse, store and place of deposit of every person carrying on business as a dealer in old metal, to inspect the same and anything therein and the book required by this Ordinance to be kept, and every person who shall prevent, hinder or obstruct any such member of the Force in the execution of his duty under this section shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding [level 1 on the uniform scale].

NOTE

In section 3, the words in square brackets were substituted by the Uniform Scale of Fines (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 1989, section 2(2), with effect from 1st July, 1989.

Commencement.

4. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1951.
