ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

2. Modifications.

The Alderney Public Health (Vermin) Law Application Ordinance, 1949

THE STATES, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Alderney (Application of Legislation) Law, 1948, hereby order as follows: –

Application of 1948 Law.

1. The Public Health (Vermin) (Guernsey) Law, 1948, shall have effect in the Island of Alderney, subject to the adaptations and modifications set out in the next succeeding section hereof.

Modifications.

2. In the application of the said Law to the Island of Alderney –
- (a) the expressions "Medical Officer of Health" and "School Medical Officer" shall respectively include any person authorised to act in the Island of Alderney by the [the President] of the States of Guernsey [Committee for Health & Social Care] or by [the President] of the States of Guernsey [Committee for Education, Sport & Culture], as the case may be, and
 - (b) the expression "**Police Court**" shall include the Court of Alderney.

NOTES

In section 2,

the words in the first and second pairs of square brackets in paragraph (a) were substituted by the Organisation of States' Affairs (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2016, section 2, Schedule 1, paragraph 5, with effect from 1st May, 2016;¹

the words in the third and fourth pairs of square brackets in paragraph (a) were substituted by the Organisation of States' Affairs (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2016, section 2, Schedule 1, paragraph

3, with effect from 1st May, 2016.²

In accordance with the provisions of the Magistrate's Court (Guernsey) Law, 1954, section 10(3) (as originally enacted), with effect from 17th January, 1955, the expression "Police Court" in this section shall be deemed to refer to the Magistrate's Court.
