## **The Guernsey Statutory Instruments (Registration) Ordinance, 1949**

**THE STATES**, on the representations of the States Advisory Council, hereby order: –

### **Statutory instruments to be delivered to Greffier.**

**1.** (1) As from the date of the coming into force of this Ordinance every statutory instrument shall forthwith upon the making thereof, whether such statutory instrument –

- (a) comes into force immediately, or
- (b) comes into force immediately, but is subject to a right of annulment by the States, or
- (c) before coming into force is subject to the approval of the States,

be delivered together with six copies thereof to His Majesty's Greffier by the person making the same.

(2) Upon the receipt of such statutory instrument and copies His Majesty's Greffier shall, in writing under his hand, certify such receipt.

### **Non-compliance with Ordinance.**

**2.** A statutory instrument shall not be invalidated solely by reason of the fact that all or any of the provisions of this Ordinance have not been complied with.

**Definition.**

3. In this Ordinance, the expression "**statutory instrument**" includes any regulation, order, rule, byelaw or other instrument of a similar nature, applying to persons in general or to any substantial class or classes of persons, made in this Island under any Act of Parliament, Order in Council, Ordinance of the Royal Court, Ordinance of the States or Order of the Royal Court.

**Commencement.**

4. This Ordinance shall come into force on the first day of June, 1949.
