ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

1-6. Sections 1-6.

(Made on the 20th May, 1949)

The Alderney Airport (Prohibition of Access) Ordinance, 1949

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the safety of Aircraft using the Alderney Airport:

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the Government of Alderney Law and under authority of the same, it is ordained as follows: –

Sections 1-6.

1. This Ordinance shall be quoted as the Alderney Airport (Prohibition of Access) Ordinance, 1949.

2. The expression "**land of the Airport**" shall mean the land within the limits of the land acquired in 1947, or which may have been or which may be subsequently acquired by the States for the use of the Airport.

3. No person, except passengers, shall enter upon the land of the Airport except as have business connected with the operation of the air services or the maintenance of the Airport.

4. No person, except those employed by the Airport or connected therewith shall drive or permit an employee or any other person to drive any vehicle or agricultural implement whatsoever within the land of the Airport.

5. No person shall permit any animal belonging to him to enter within the limits of the land of the Airport, other than for transport.

6. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punishable with a fine which may extend to [level 1 on the Alderney uniform scale] or with imprisonment up to one month, or with both.

NOTES

Consolidated text

In this Ordinance, the words and figure in square brackets in section 6 were substituted by the Uniform Scale of Fines (Alderney) Law, 1989, section 2(2), with effect from 1st October, 1989.

The Ordinance was made and came into operation on 20th May, 1949.
