LA COUR, ouïes les conclusions des Officiers du Roi, a approuvé les Règlements suivants faits par le Comité pour le Police Salariée de l'Île: –

Mascots.

- "P" 2. On and after the 1st March, 1935: no vehicle using the public highway shall carry any pointed mascot, ornament, or device so placed as to be likely to cause injury to any person in the event of a collision.

NOTES

In accordance with the provisions of the Reform (Guernsey) Law, 1948, Article 70(3), with effect from 1st January, 1950, this formerly Provisional Ordinance of the Royal Court became a Permanent Ordinance of the States.

In accordance with the provisions of the Road Traffic (Drink Driving) (Guernsey) Law, 1989, section 2A(7), Schedule, with effect from 11th February, 2004, offences under this Ordinance constitute "traffic offences" for the purposes of the 1989 Law.

In accordance with the provisions of the Offences (Fixed Penalties) (Guernsey) Law, 2009, section 1, section 2 and the Schedule, with effect from 1st July, 2012, any liability to conviction of offences against Regulation "P" 2 of this Ordinance may be discharged by payment of a fixed penalty.¹

Mudguards.

- "P" 3. On and after the 1st July, 1935: no person shall use or permit to be used on a public highway any motor vehicle which is not provided with mudguards or other similar means, to catch as far as practicable mud or water thrown up by the rotation of the wheels, unless adequate protection is afforded by the body of the vehicle.

NOTE

In accordance with the provisions of the Offences (Fixed Penalties) (Guernsey) Law, 2009, section 1, section 2 and the Schedule, with effect from 1st July, 2012, any liability to conviction of offences against Regulation "P" 2 of this Ordinance may be discharged by payment of a fixed penalty.²

Yellow Lines.

"R" 2. ...

NOTE

Regulation "R" 2 of this Ordinance was repealed by the Traffic Signs and Traffic Light Signals Ordinance, 1988, section 17(1), Schedule 5, with effect from 1st June 1988.

Bicycles—two brakes.

"S" 2. On and after the 1st April, 1935: every bicycle when being ridden, shall have two independent brakes in good working order and of such efficiency that the application of either brake shall be capable of preventing the wheel to which it is applied from revolving.

NOTES

The Ordinance was made and came into operation on 9th February, 1935.

In accordance with the provisions of the Offences (Fixed Penalties) (Guernsey) Law, 2009, section 1, section 2 and the Schedule, with effect from 1st July, 2012, any liability to conviction of offences against Regulation "S" 2 of this Ordinance may be discharged by payment of a fixed penalty.³
