The Health Service (Payment of Authorised Suppliers) Regulations, 2003

THE GUERNSEY SOCIAL SECURITY AUTHORITY, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 14 and 35 of the Health Service (Benefit) (Guernsey) Law, 1990, as amended^a, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders: –

Interpretation.

1. (1) In these regulations, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say –

"accounting period" means, in relation to items of pharmaceutical benefit and Part I and Part II appliances supplied by an authorised supplier or authorised appliance supplier, the period of one calendar month,

"basic price", in relation to the ingredients of any item of pharmaceutical benefit, or in relation to a Part I or Part II appliance, means the price which is, at the date on which that item or appliance (as the case may be) is supplied under the Law, the basic price thereof applicable in relation to pharmacy contractors and calculated in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the Drug Tariff,

[**"designated Alderney authorised supplier"** means the authorised

supplier of pharmaceutical benefit in Alderney who is designated by the Administrator for the purposes of regulation 4D,]

["**community pack**" means a medication storage, handling and administration system for use in the community, provided in accordance with the terms and conditions that may be determined by the [Committee for Health & Social Care] from time to time,]

["**the Guernsey Health Reserve**" has the meaning given in the Health Service Fund (Closure) Regulations, 2021,]

["**Medication Administration Record**" means an administration system, for use in nursing and residential homes, provided in accordance with the terms and conditions that may be determined by the Committee for Health & Social Care from time to time,]

["**medicines use review**" means an approved system of review of the medicines prescribed to a patient, carried out in accordance with the terms and conditions that may be determined by the [Committee for Health & Social Care] from time to time,]

["**monitored dosage system**" means a medication storage, handling and administration system, for use in nursing and residential homes, provided in accordance with the terms and conditions that may be determined by the [Committee for Health & Social Care] from time to time,]

"non-business day" means –

- (a) a Sunday, Good Friday, Christmas Day,

- (b) in relation to Guernsey, Herm and Jethou, a day appointed as a bank holiday by Ordinance of the States of Guernsey,
- (c) in relation to Alderney, a day appointed as a bank holiday by Ordinance of the States of Alderney,
- (d) a day appointed as a day of public thanksgiving or public mourning,

"Part I appliance" and **"Part II appliance"** mean, respectively any appliance described in Part I or Part II (as the case may be) of the First Schedule to the Health Service (Medical Appliances) Regulations, 1990, as amended^b,

"the Law" means the Health Service (Benefit) (Guernsey) Law, 1990, as amended.

(2) Except where the context otherwise requires, any reference in these regulations to any enactment or regulations shall be construed as including a reference to that enactment or those regulations, as the case may be, as amended, repealed, replaced, revoked, extended or applied, by or under any other enactment or by any other regulations.

(3) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948^c shall apply to the interpretation of these regulations as it applies to the interpretation of a Guernsey

The functions, rights and liabilities of the Committee for Employment & Social Security arising under Parts II to VI, sections 21 to 23, and Parts VIII to X of the Health Service (Benefit) (Guernsey) Law, 1990 (other than in the definitions of "approved primary care mental health and wellbeing service arrangement" and "approved visiting medical specialist arrangement" in section 39(1) of that Law, as that Law applies in relation to specialist medical benefit by virtue of the Health Service (Specialist Medical Benefit) Ordinance, 1995) were transferred to and vested in the Committee for Health & Social Care by the provisions of the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2020, section 1(a) and section 4, with effect from 1st June, 2020 and subject to, first, the savings and transitional provisions in section 3 and, second, the exceptions in section 5 of the 2020 Ordinance.²

In accordance with the provisions of the Bills of Exchange (Guernsey) Law, 1958, section 1B, with effect from 27 July, 1993, the references in this regulation to a bank holiday shall be construed as a reference to a public holiday within the meaning of section 1(1) of the 1958 Law.

The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 has since been repealed by the Interpretation and Standard Provisions (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2016, section 28(a), with effect from 1st October, 2018.

Payment of Authorised Suppliers in Respect of Each Item of Pharmaceutical Benefit.

2. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next following paragraph, an authorised supplier of any class not employed by the [Committee for Health & Social Care] shall be paid out of [the Guernsey Health Reserve], in respect of each item of pharmaceutical benefit supplied by him under the Law, the sum of the following amounts, that is to say –

- (a) an amount equal to the amount of the basic price of the ingredients,
- (b) a dispensing fee calculated on the basis of the number of relevant items supplied, as set out in Part I of the First Schedule to these regulations in respect of that class of authorised supplier; and for the purposes of this sub-paragraph the "**number of relevant items**" is the aggregate of –
 - (i) the number of items of pharmaceutical benefit supplied by that authorised supplier during the accounting period in which the item of pharmaceutical benefit in question was supplied, and
 - (ii) the number of all Part I and Part II appliances so supplied,

- (c) an additional dispensing fee in accordance with Part II of the First Schedule to these regulations in respect of that class of authorised supplier,
- (d) the products of the percentages specified in the Third Schedule to these regulations in respect of that class of supplier and that description of pharmaceutical benefit in accordance with that Schedule and the amount of the basic price.

(2) The amount payable to an authorised supplier of any class, not employed by the [Committee for Health & Social Care], under paragraph (1) of this regulation in respect of any item of pharmaceutical benefit shall be reduced by an amount equal to the amount of any prescription charge received or recoverable by him in respect of that item.

(3) Where an approved medical practitioner or approved dentist who is not in either case an authorised supplier has supplied pharmaceutical benefit under and in accordance with the provisions of regulation 4 of the Health Service (Pharmaceutical Benefit) Regulations, 1990, as amended^d, he shall –

- (a) comply with the provisions of sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 5 of Part II of the Schedule to the Health Service (Authorised Suppliers) Regulations, 1990^e, in relation to the pharmaceutical benefit so supplied by him in all respects as if he were an authorised supplier,

- (b) be paid out of [the Guernsey Health Reserve] in respect of each item of pharmaceutical benefit so supplied an amount equal to the amount which would have been payable to him under paragraph (1) of this regulation if he were an authorised supplier, reduced by an amount equal to the amount of any prescription charge received or recoverable by him in respect of that item.

(4) An authorised supplier who is a pharmacist employed by the [Committee for Health & Social Care] shall be paid out of [the Guernsey Health Reserve], in respect of each item of pharmaceutical benefit supplied by him under the Law, an amount equal to the amount of the basic price of the ingredients.

Additional Payments to Authorised Suppliers who are Pharmacists not Employed by Medical Practices in Respect of Medical Prescriptions Dispensed Urgently.

3. (1) Subject to the provisions of the next following paragraph, an authorised supplier who is a pharmacist not employed by a medical practice or the [Committee for Health & Social Care] shall be paid out of [the Guernsey Health Reserve] in respect of any medical prescription on which he has supplied pharmaceutical benefit (irrespective of the number of items of pharmaceutical benefit supplied by him on that medical prescription), in addition to the sum payable to him in respect of that pharmaceutical benefit under the last foregoing regulation –

- (a) where that medical prescription is endorsed with the word "URGENT" by the approved medical practitioner or approved dentist who has issued the same, and that medical prescription has been endorsed by that authorised supplier with the date and time on and at which that pharmaceutical benefit was supplied by him, or
- (b) where that medical prescription is not so endorsed with the word "URGENT" and –
 - (i) that pharmaceutical benefit was supplied by that authorised supplier either on the day on which that medical prescription was issued and after he had closed his premises for the supply of pharmaceutical benefit or between 11 pm that day and 9 a.m. the next day or such earlier time at which the said premises were opened for the supply of pharmaceutical benefit, and

- (ii) that medical prescription has been endorsed by that authorised supplier with the words "DISPENSED URGENTLY" and with the date and time on and at which that pharmaceutical benefit was supplied, and has been signed by the authorised supplier and by the person in respect of whom that pharmaceutical benefit was required or by his parent, guardian or other representatives,

and that pharmaceutical benefit has been supplied at any of the times specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to these regulations, not being a time when that authorised supplier is required to keep his said premises open outside his normal hours of business in accordance with a scheme for the time being in force and prepared by [the Committee for Health & Social Care] in pursuance of the provisions of section 12(3)(d) of the Law or with any other scheme approved by [the Committee for Health & Social Care], an additional dispensing fee in the sum specified in the second column of that Schedule in relation to that time.

(2) The provisions of paragraph (1) of this regulation shall not apply, other than in the Island of Alderney, in respect of any pharmaceutical benefit supplied by an authorised supplier at a time when the premises for the supply of pharmaceutical benefit of any other authorised supplier, being a pharmacist not employed by a medical practice, are open for business.

Reimbursement in Respect of Out-of-pocket Expenses Incurred by Authorised Suppliers who are Pharmacists not Employed by Medical Practices.

4. Where [the Committee for Health & Social Care] is satisfied that out-of-pocket expenses have been incurred by an authorised supplier who is a pharmacist not employed by a medical practice or the [Committee for Health & Social Care] in procuring any pharmaceutical benefit required to be supplied on a medical prescription by reason of the fact that such pharmaceutical benefit is only very exceptionally so required to be supplied, [the Committee for Health & Social Care] may reimburse that authorised supplier in respect of the whole of such expenses or in respect of such part thereof as [the Committee for Health & Social Care] thinks fit.

Provision of Information by Authorised Suppliers and Surveys of Their Places of Business.

5. (1) For the purpose of enabling [the Committee for Health & Social Care] to determine from time to time the adequacy or otherwise of any of the amounts payable to authorised suppliers under regulation 2(1) of these regulations, other than subparagraph (a) thereof, an authorised supplier –

- (a) shall furnish on demand to [the Committee for Health & Social Care], or to such person as [the Committee for Health & Social Care] may direct, such information and such documents as [the Committee for Health & Social Care] may require for that purpose, and
- (b) shall permit any person authorised in writing in that behalf by [the Committee for Health & Social Care] to enter at all reasonable times any place of business at which he supplies pharmaceutical benefit or from which he supplies such benefit and to make such inspection, examination and enquiry therein as may be required for the said purpose.

(2) No information obtained by [the Committee for Health & Social Care] or by any such person as aforesaid in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this regulation, shall be disclosed to any person otherwise than for the purpose stated in paragraph (1); and no such information shall be disclosed in such manner as to enable any authorised supplier or any place of business of an authorised supplier to be

identified.
