The Ordinance Regarding Itinerant Hawkers, 1939

Itinerant Hawkers.

Any person who goes from place to place or to private houses carrying or causing to be carried goods which he sells or offers or exposes for sale must apply to the Constable who will make an application to the Court for a licence which shall be [£40 for a term of twelve months], this will not apply to *bona fide* travellers. [The said fee may be varied from time to time by Resolution of the Chief Pleas.] A hawker shall not be permitted to hawk goods other than that specified in his licence under a penalty of a fine at the deliberation of the Court.

NOTES

In this Ordinance, the words in the first and second pairs of square brackets were, respectively, substituted and inserted by the Itinerant Hawkers (Amendment) (Sark) Ordinance, 2021, section 1(2) and section 1(3), with effect from 1st January, 2022.

The Ordinance was made and came into force at the Michaelmas Meeting of the Chief Pleas held on the 8th November, 1939.
