The Control of Intoxicating Liquor (Designated Public Places) (Church Square) Order, 2022

Made

7th February, 2022

Coming into operation

On being made

THE COMMITTEE FOR HOME AFFAIRS, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 2(1) and (2) of the Control of Intoxicating Liquor (Designated Public Places) Ordinance, 2007^a, as amended, hereby orders:-

1. In order to prevent nuisance or annoyance to members of the public or a section of the public or disorder which is likely to be associated with the consumption of intoxicating liquor in that place, the area of the parish of St Peter Port marked in red on the attached plan, that is:-

- (a) Quay Street from its junction with the Quay to its junction with the High Street,
- (b) Church Square and the pedestrian areas and paths, immediately to the north, south, east and west of St Peter Port Church,
- (c) Market Hill, as far as the entrance to the Commercial Arcade,
- (d) the steps leading from Church Square up to the Commercial

Arcade, and

- (e) Cow Lane from its junction with the Quay and Church Square,

shall be a designated public place for the purpose of the Control of Intoxicating Liquor (Designated Public Places) Ordinance, 2007 during the hours and days specified in article 2.

2. Subject to article 3, the area specified in article 1 shall be a designated public place between 7th February 2022 and 12.00 midnight on 14th May 2022.

3. The area specified in article 1 shall not be a designated public place at any time when the Town Church is hosting an event at which alcohol is served for consumption in any place outside the church but within the area specified in article 1, for the duration of that event.

4. This Order may be cited as the Control of Intoxicating Liquor (Designated Public Places) (Church Square) Order, 2022 and shall come into force on the 7th February, 2022.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order sets out the area of St Peter Port to be designated as a Designated Public Place under the provisions of Control of Intoxicating Liquor (Designated Public Places) Ordinance, 2007, between 7th February 2022 and 12.00 midnight on 14th May 2022. The area specified in this Order shall not be a designated public place at any time when the Town Church is hosting an event at which alcohol is served for consumption in any place outside the church but within the area specified.

This Order comes into force on 7th February, 2022.
