**The Waste Management Services (Charging)
Regulations, 2023**

THE WASTE DISPOSAL AUTHORITY^a, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 1 and 3 of the Waste Management Services (Charging) Ordinance, 2018^b and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:-

Amendment of the Waste Management Services (Charging) Ordinance, 2018.

1. The Schedule to the Waste Management Services (Charging) Ordinance, 2018 is amended as follows -

(a) in Table A of Part I -

(i) for "£1.70" substitute "£1.79", and

- (ii) for "£3.07" substitute "£3.22",
- (b) in Table B of Part I -
 - (i) for "£1.70" substitute "£1.79", and
 - (ii) for "£3.07" substitute "£3.22", and
- (c) in Part II, for "£102.97" substitute "£107.97".

Revocation.

2. The Waste Management Services (Charging) (No.2) Regulations, 2022^c are revoked.

Citation and commencement.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Waste Management Services (Charging) Regulations, 2023 and shall come into force on the 1st January, 2024.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Schedule to the Waste Management Services (Charging) Ordinance, 2018 to increase the prescribed bag charges for residual waste bags of both sizes (up to and including 50 litres in capacity and those 51 to 90 litres in capacity) by 5%. They also increase the annual fixed charge for waste management services provided by the Waste Disposal Authority by £5.

The charges have been increased in line with the resolutions made by the States of Deliberation at their meeting on 8th September 2022 (Resolutions 4 and 5 of Article IV of Billet d'Etat XIII of 2022) that the household charges should be increased annually from 2023 to 2025 by no more than an annual increase of RPIX plus 1% (capped at 5%) to the "pay as you throw" bag charge for general waste and by no more than an increase of RPIX plus 1% (capped at £5) per year to the Waste Disposal Authority's annual waste charge.

These Regulations come into force on the 1st January, 2024.
