Explanatory Note.

(Made on 10th November, 2016.)

The Limited Partnerships (Fees, Annual Validations and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations, 2016

THE COMMITTEE FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 36(1)(c), 43 and 44 of the Limited Partnerships (Guernsey) Law, 1995^a, hereby makes the following Regulations: –

Liability to pay annual validation fee.

1. In each calendar year, before the 30th June, every limited partnership registered before 1st May in that year shall pay to [the Registrar of Companies] the annual validation fee specified in paragraph (A) of the Schedule.

NOTES

In regulation 1, the words in square brackets were substituted by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2023, section 2(2), with effect from 27th July, 2023, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 3 of the 2023 Ordinance.

The functions, rights and liabilities of His Majesty's Greffier arising under these Regulations were transferred to and vested in the Registrar of Companies appointed under section 495 of the Companies (Guernsey) Law, 2008 by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2023, section 1, with effect from 27th July, 2023, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 3 of the 2023 Ordinance.

Other fees.

2. (1) The fees specified in column 2 of the Schedule are payable to [the Registrar of Companies] –

- (a) by the limited partnership or other person by or for and on behalf of whom the application is made for the service mentioned in paragraph (B) or (C) of column 1 of the Schedule, or, as the case may be,
- (b) by the limited partnership or other person for and on behalf of whom the service mentioned in paragraph (B) or (C) of column 1 of the Schedule is to be provided.

NOTE

In regulation 2, the words in square brackets were substituted by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2023, section 2(2), with effect from 27th July, 2023, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 3 of the 2023 Ordinance.

Duty to submit annual validation.

3. (1) In each calendar year, before the 30th [March], every limited partnership registered before [1st of February] in that year shall complete, and deliver to [the Registrar of Companies] –

- (a) an annual validation, and
- (b) a declaration of compliance (annual validation).

(2) The annual validation shall be in such form as [the Registrar of Companies] may require, and shall state –

- (a) the name of the limited partnership,
- (b) its registered office,

- (c) its principal place of business,
- (d) the nature and purpose of its business,
- [(da) the category or categories of limited partnership to which it belongs, by reference to a system of classifying limited partnerships prepared by [the Registrar of Companies],]
- (e) the full name of every general partner and his address (being, in the case of a body corporate or a partnership, the address of its registered office or, if none, its principal office),
- [(ea) with regard to each general partner who is an individual, whether or not that general partner is licensed to act as a general partner of the limited partnership,
- (eb) where a general partner who is an individual is not licensed to act as a general partner of the limited partnership –
 - (i) whether that general partner is unrewarded or is exempt, and
 - (ii) in the case of a general partner who is exempt, the applicable provisions,]

Consolidated text

- (f) the term for which the limited partnership is entered into and the date of the commencement of that term or, if no term is fixed for its duration, a statement to that effect,
- (g) the date of the expiration of its fixed term or, if no term is fixed for its duration, the date of the expiration of a period of 30 years beginning on the date of its registration,
- [(ga) whether the limited partnership is exempt from the beneficial ownership requirements at Part IVB of the Law and, if so, the grounds on which it is so exempt,
- (gaa) in relation to a resident agent, if applicable–
 - (i) that the limited partnership has a resident agent in accordance with the requirements of Part IVB of the Law,
 - (ii) the particulars of its resident agent required to be entered in its record of resident agent under section 32HC of the Law,
 - (iii) that the limited partnership has kept a record of its resident agent and has notified the Registrar of any change in its resident agent or in the details contained in its record of resident agent in accordance with section 32HC of the Law,

- (iv) an address for service (and such other contact details for that resident agent as the Registrar may specify),
 - (v) the length of time for which the resident agent has been a general partner of the limited partnership or otherwise associated with it,
 - (vi) whether the resident agent has served a notice under section 9 of the Beneficial Ownership Law on any person in respect of the beneficial owners of the limited partnership within such period as the Registrar of Companies may direct,
- (gab) the category or categories of its principal business activities by reference to a system of classifying business activities prepared by the Registrar,]
- [(gb) [for limited partnerships to which this subparagraph applies], whether the limited partnership has[, in respect of such matters as the Registrar of Companies may specify,] an ongoing business relationship with a person licensed or authorised by, or registered with, the Commission, and, if so, the nature of that relationship,
- (gc) for limited partnerships to which this subparagraph applies –

- (i) where the accounts of the limited partnership have not been audited, whether they have been otherwise examined by an accountant, and
 - (ii) whether the limited partnership is directed and managed in Guernsey,
- (gd) for limited partnerships to which this subparagraph applies, the jurisdiction of incorporation of any direct subsidiaries of the limited partnership and such other matters in relation to those subsidiaries as [the Registrar of Companies] may specify,
- (ge) for limited partnerships to which this subparagraph applies, the location of any real property [or high value asset] held by the limited partnership, and such other matters in relation to that property [or asset] as [the Registrar of Companies] may specify,
- (gf) for limited partnerships to which this subparagraph applies –
 - (i) the nature of the activities of the limited partnership,
 - (ii) the locations in which those activities are carried out, and
 - (iii) such other matters in relation to those activities as [the Registrar of Companies] may specify,]

[(gg) for limited partnerships to which this subparagraph applies, whether the limited partnership –

(i) is a settlor, trustee, protector or beneficiary of an existing express trust (or occupies an equivalent role in relation to another form of legal arrangement), or

(ii) exercises control over an express trust (or another form of legal arrangement),

and if so, such other matters in relation to that trust or other legal arrangement as the Registrar of Companies may specify,]

[(h) that the limited partnership's register of limited partners is kept and maintained at its registered office in accordance with section 15 of the Law, and was correct and current as at the 31st May of the year to which the annual validation relates,

(ha) that the limited partnership has complied, over the course of the year, with its obligations to keep and maintain records under the Law, including its obligations to keep and maintain records at its registered office under section 15 of the Law,

(hb) that the records required to be kept under the Law (including those kept for the purposes of section 15 of the Law) are correct and current as at the 31st May of the year to which the annual validation relates,

- (hc) that the limited partnership, where applicable, has complied with its obligations under the Law to deliver copies of documents, or give notice to the Registrar of changes to information filed with the Registrar, as the case may be,]
- (i) whether or not the limited partnership has appointed auditors under section 16 of the Law to act in relation to its affairs,
- [(j) that the information contained in the annual validation was correct and current as at the 31st May of the year to which it relates, and]
- (k) such other information as [the Registrar of Companies] may require.

(3) The information required to be stated in the annual validation shall be [correct and] current as at the [last day of February] in the calendar year in which the return is required to be delivered.

- (4) The annual validation shall be signed or made by –
 - (a) one or more of the general partners, or
 - (b) a corporate services provider acting under the authority of and for and on behalf of a general partner and in accordance with the terms and conditions of that authority.

(5) A copy of the annual validation shall be kept at the limited partnership's registered office; and the provisions of section 15 of the Law shall apply to that copy as that section applies to the partnership agreement.

[(6) Subparagraphs (gb) to (gg) of paragraph (2) do not apply to a limited partnership which is licensed, authorised or registered by the Commission.]

[(7) ...]

[(8) For the purposes of this paragraph –

(a) "**Commission**" means the Guernsey Financial Services Commission,

(b) "**directed and managed in Guernsey**" has the same meaning as in the Income Tax (Substance Requirements) (Implementation) Regulations, [2021],

(c) "**the Fiduciaries Law**" means the Regulation of Fiduciaries, Administration Businesses and Company Directors, etc (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2000,

(d) "**fiduciary licence**" has the same meaning as in the Fiduciaries Law,

[(da) "**high value asset**" means –

(i) any single item of tangible personal property, or

(ii) a collection of items of tangible personal property of the same type held for the primary

purpose of financial gain, or the preservation of wealth,

which a reasonable person would believe to have a market value greater than £5 million,

- (db) "**market value**", for the purposes of paragraph (da), means the price which that single item or collection of items (as the case may be) might reasonably be expected to fetch in a sale in an open market.]
- (e) a general partner is licensed to act as a general partner of the limited partnership if that general partner holds a fiduciary licence,
- (f) an unrewarded general partner is one who is not rewarded within the meaning of subparagraph (g),
- (g) a general partner is rewarded if that general partner is acting as a general partner of the limited partnership by way of business within the meaning of the Fiduciaries Law,
- (h) a general partner is exempt if that general partner would be required to hold a fiduciary licence in acting as a general partner of the limited partnership but for the application of one or more of the exemptions at section 3 of the Fiduciaries Law,
- (i) the applicable provisions are the subsections of section 3 of the Fiduciaries Law which have the effect of

exempting the general partner in question from the requirement to hold a fiduciary licence with regard to his or her acting as a general partner for the limited partnership, and

- (j) a person is linked to a limited partnership if –
 - (i) that person is a general partner of the limited partnership or is otherwise involved in its management or administration, or
 - (ii) an employee or official of that person is a general partner of the limited partnership or is otherwise involved in its management or administration.]

The Regulation of Fiduciaries, Administration Businesses and Company Directors, etc (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2000 has since been repealed by the Regulation of Fiduciaries, Administration Businesses and Company Directors, etc (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2020, section 62(a), with effect from 1st November, 2021, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 60 of the 2020 Law.

Declaration of compliance (annual validation).

4. (l) A declaration of compliance (annual validation) is a declaration, signed or made by –

- (a) one or more of the general partners, or
- (b) a corporate services provider acting under the authority of and for and on behalf of a general partner and in accordance with the terms and conditions of that authority, that all the requirements [of the Law and any regulations made under it (including these regulations)]

in respect of the annual validation have been complied with.

(2) The declaration of compliance must be delivered to [the Registrar of Companies] at the same time as the annual validation.

NOTES

In regulation 4,

[Registrar of Companies] may rely upon annual validation and declaration of compliance.

5. [The Registrar of Companies], when performing his functions under the provisions of the Law or any regulations made under it (including these regulations), may rely upon the information and statements contained in the annual validation, and upon the declaration of compliance (annual validation), in all respects and accordingly is not bound to enquire further as to whether, in relation to the annual validation and declaration and the matters required to be stated therein, those provisions have been complied with.

NOTE

In regulation 5 and the marginal note thereto, the words in square brackets were substituted by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2023, section 2(2), with effect from 27th July, 2023, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 3 of the 2023 Ordinance.

Non-compliant annual validations or declarations of compliance.

6. An annual validation or declaration of compliance (annual validation) which has been delivered to [the Registrar of Companies] which does not comply with all the requirements of these regulations shall be treated as if it had not been delivered to [the Registrar of Companies].

NOTE

In regulation 6, the words in square brackets were substituted by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2023, section 2(2), with effect from 27th July, 2023, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 3 of the 2023 Ordinance.

Non-submission of annual validation or declaration of compliance.

7. (1) Where a limited partnership fails to deliver to [the Registrar of Companies] an annual validation or declaration of compliance (annual validation) in accordance with the provisions of these regulations –

- (a) the partnership and each general partner thereof are guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding level 5 on the uniform scale, and
- (b) ...
- [(c) the partnership is liable to be struck off the Register of Limited Partnerships in accordance with Part IVA of the Law.]

(2) Section 31(7) of the Law applies in respect of an offence under paragraph (1)(a) as it applies in respect of an offence under section 31 of the Law.

NOTES

Register and information may be in electronic form.

8. The Register of Limited Partnerships, and any other information held by [the Registrar of Companies] under the provisions of or for the purposes of the Law, may be in electronic form.

NOTE

In regulation 8, the words in square brackets were substituted by the Machinery of Government (Transfer of Functions) Ordinance, 2023, section 2(2), with effect from 27th July, 2023, subject to the savings and transitional provisions in section 3 of the 2023 Ordinance.

Documents to be submitted in electronic form and by electronic means.

9. (1) Where a document is required or permitted to be submitted to [the Registrar of Companies] under the provisions of or for the purposes of the Law or any regulations made under it (including these regulations), and except to the extent that express provision to the contrary is made by or under the provisions of the Law or any regulations made under it (including these regulations), the document –

- (a) shall be in such electronic form, and shall be submitted by such electronic means, as [the Registrar of Companies] may require, whether in any particular case or class of cases or generally, or
- (b) shall be in such non-electronic form, and shall be submitted by such non-electronic means, as [the Registrar of Companies] may in his absolute discretion permit in any particular case or class of case.

(2) Where a document is required under the provisions of or for the purposes of the Law or any regulations made under it (including these regulations) to be in such form as [the Registrar of Companies] may require, [the Registrar of Companies] may, in his absolute discretion and without limitation, require the document to be in such electronic form or non-electronic form as he may require, whether in any particular case or class of cases or generally.

(3) This regulation applies, without limitation, to any, and to anything accompanying any, application, notice, return, validation, accounts, report, statement, consent, declaration, questionnaire, computation, plan or signature.

(4) This regulation is in addition to and not in derogation from the provisions of the Electronic Transactions (Guernsey) Law, 2000^b.

Retention of copies of records in electronic form.

10. (1) Documents received or issued by or on behalf of [the Registrar of Companies] under or for the purposes of the Law or any regulations made under it (including these regulations), including documents in electronic form or sent by electronic means may, if a copy of the document is retained in electronic form, be destroyed or otherwise disposed of.

(2) A copy of a document retained in electronic form pursuant to paragraph (1) –

(a) may be received in evidence, and

(b) unless the contrary is proved, is deemed to be a copy of the document of which it purports to be a copy.

(3) This regulation is in addition to and not in derogation from the provisions of the Electronic Transactions (Guernsey) Law, 2000^c.

NOTE

Rectification of the Register.

11. After section 8(4) of the Law insert the following subsections –

" (4A) The Greffier may, in his absolute discretion and on such terms and conditions as he thinks fit, on an application by or on behalf of any partner of a limited partnership or of his own motion, rectify any error or formal defect –

- (a) in the entries relating to the partnership in the Register, or
- (b) in any declaration or other document filed with the Greffier in relation to the partnership under or for the purposes of this Law or any regulations made under it.

(4B) Subsection (4A) applies in respect of a copy of a document retained in electronic form pursuant to regulation 10 of the Limited Partnerships (Fees, Annual Validations and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations, 2016 as it applies in respect of an original document."³

Repeal.

12. The Limited Partnerships (Fees and Annual Returns) Regulations, 2008^d are repealed.

Interpretation.

13. (1) In these regulations –

"corporate services provider" means a person who holds a full fiduciary licence within the meaning of the Regulation of Fiduciaries, Administration Businesses and Company Directors, etc (Bailiwick of

Guernsey) Law, 2000^e,

"the Law" means the Limited Partnerships (Guernsey) Law, 1995, and, unless the contrary intention appears, other expressions have the same meaning as in the Law.

(2) References in these regulations to an enactment are references thereto as from time to time amended, repealed and replaced (with or without modification), extended or applied.

(3) The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948^f applies to the interpretation of these regulations.

NOTE

The Interpretation (Guernsey) Law, 1948 has since been repealed by the Interpretation and Standard Provisions (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2016, section 28(a), with effect from 1st October, 2018.

Citation.

14. These regulations may be cited as the Limited Partnerships (Fees, Annual Validations and Miscellaneous Provisions) Regulations, 2016.

Commencement.

15. These regulations shall come into force on the 15th November, 2016.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)***

These regulations prescribe the fees payable to the Greffier in respect of services in relation to limited partnerships, including an annual £500 fee on all limited partnerships registered in Guernsey; require all such limited partnerships to file an annual validation with the Greffier setting out prescribed particulars; provide that the Greffier may rectify errors or formal defects in the limited partnership register; and make provision for electronic record keeping.

** The text of this Explanatory Note is as it was when the Statutory Instrument was first made – that is to say that the Explanatory Note has not been updated to take account of any changes made by subsequent amending Statutory Instruments with their own Explanatory Notes.
