The International Criminal Court (Forms)

(Bailiwick of Guernsey) Rules, 2024

THE ROYAL COURT, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 7 and 12 of the International Criminal Court (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2019^a, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Consent to surrender.

1. Consent to surrender given under section 7 of the Law must be in writing in the form set out in Schedule 1.

Waiver of the right to review.

2. Waiver of the right to review given under section 12 of the Law must be in writing in the form set out in Schedule 2.

Interpretation.

3. In these Rules -

"the International Criminal Court" means the International Criminal Court established by the Statute of the International Criminal Court, done at Rome on 17th July 1998, and

"the Law" means the International Criminal Court (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2019.

Citation.

4. These Rules may be cited as the International Criminal Court (Forms) (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Rules, 2024.

Commencement.

5. These Rules shall come into force on 15th October, 2024.

proceedings for the determination of whether I was lawfully arrested in pursuance of the warrant and whether my rights have been respected, and

- (c) if a delivery order is made, to seek a review of the delivery order, and
- (d) not to have the delivery order executed against me until after the end of the period of 15 days beginning with the date on which the order is made or (if later) while any review proceedings are still pending.

I therefore give notice of my consent to surrender to be delivered up into the custody of the International Criminal Court or into the custody of the state of enforcement, whichever is appropriate. I understand that by consenting to my surrender I waive my right to seek a review of the delivery order under section 11 of the International Criminal Court (Bailiwick of Guernsey) Law, 2019 and I consent to the States of Guernsey Committee for Home Affairs giving directions for the execution of the delivery order before the period of 15 days has expired.
