On behalf of the Secretary-General, I acknowledge receipt, on 26 February 2013, of your letter of notification, dated 20 February 2013, regarding the extension, by the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, of the Protocol of 2003 to the International Convention on the Establishment of an International Fund for Compensation for Oil Pollution Damage, 1992, to the Bailiwick of Guernsey.

Your Excellency,

I have the honour, on instructions from Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs, to refer to the Protocol of 2003 to amend the International Convention on the Establishment of an International Fund for Compensation for Oil Pollution Damage, 1992 which was done at London on 16 May 2003, and to which the United Kingdom acceded on 8 June 2006, taking effect from 8 September 2006.

I now have the honour to inform you that the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland wishes the United Kingdom's accession to the Protocol to be extended to the Bailiwick of Guernsey, being a territory for whose international relations the United Kingdom is responsible.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland considers the extension of the Protocol to the Bailiwick of Guernsey to take effect from the date of deposit of this note, and would welcome confirmation of this date from the International Maritime Organization.

I avail myself of this opportunity to renew to Your Excellency the assurances of my highest consideration.
