The Bailiff having this day placed before the Court a letter registering and confirming the extension of an Amendment to the Agreement on the Conservation of Bats in Europe to the Bailiwick of Guernsey,

THE COURT, after the reading of the said letter and after having heard Her Majesty's Procureur thereon, ORDERED

1. That the said letter be registered on the records of this Island; and
2. That an extract of this present Act, together with a copy of the said letter be sent by Her Majesty's Greffier to the Clerk of the Court of Alderney and to the Seneschal of Sark for registration on the records of those Islands respectively.

Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign and Commonwealth Affairs presents his compliments to Their Excellencies and Messieurs and Mesdames the Heads of Missions of Certain Governments with reference to:

**the Amendment to the Agreement on the Conservation of Bats in Europe adopted at a meeting of the Parties to the Agreement, held at Bristol from 24 to 26 July 2000,**

and has the honour to inform them that on 9 May 2002 the depositary received an instrument of acceptance to the above Amendment from the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. The United Kingdom's acceptance of the above Agreement is in respect of:

The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and  
Gibraltar  
The Bailiwick of Guernsey  
The Bailiwick of Jersey,  
The Isle of Man

being territories for whose international relations the United Kingdom is responsible.

In accordance with Article VII(4) of the Agreement on the Conservation of Bats in Europe (done at London on 4 December 1991, as Amended), the above Amendment shall enter into force for the United Kingdom and the above territories on 8 June 2002.
