**The Road Traffic (Designated Healthcare Professionals)
(Guernsey) Order, 2025**

THE COMMITTEE FOR HOME AFFAIRS, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 10(1) of the Road Traffic (Drink Driving) (Guernsey) Law, 1989^a and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders:-

Designation of healthcare professionals.

1. Paramedics for the time being registered under section 3 of the Registered Health Professionals Ordinance, 2006^b are designated for the purposes of the definition of "**designated healthcare professional**" in section 10(1) of the Road Traffic (Drink Driving) (Guernsey) Law, 1989.

Citation.

2. This Order may be cited as the Road Traffic (Designated Healthcare Professionals) (Guernsey) Order, 2025.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order designates registered paramedics for the purposes of the definition of "**designated healthcare professional**" in section 10(1) of the Road Traffic (Drink Driving) (Guernsey) Law, 1989 ("**the Law**"), as amended by the Road Traffic (Drink Driving) (Guernsey) Law, 1989 (Amendment) Ordinance, 2025 ("**the Ordinance**").

This designation enables registered paramedics (alongside registered nurses and registered medical practitioners) to take blood samples, give advice and provide opinions for the purposes of the Road Traffic (Drink Driving) (Guernsey) Law, 1989.

This Order comes into force on the 12th May, 2025.
