**The Immigration (Ports of Entry) (Bailiwick of  
Guernsey) Order, 2025**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 33(3) of the Immigration Act 1971<sup>a</sup> and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby order:-

**Ports of entry.**

1. Each port specified in the Schedule is a port of entry for the purposes of the Immigration Act 1971 as it has effect in the Bailiwick of Guernsey.

**Revocation of Order of 1972.**

2. The Immigration (Ports of Entry) Order, 1972<sup>b</sup> is revoked.

3. This Order has effect in the Bailiwick of Guernsey.


**Citation.**

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Order)*

This Order designates the ports specified in the Schedule as ports of entry for the purposes of the Immigration Act, 1971, as extended to the Bailiwick. It revokes and replaces the Immigration (Ports of Entry) Order, 1972.

Under paragraph 26 of Schedule 2 to the Act, the owners and agents of a ship or aircraft employed to carry passengers for reward are prohibited from arranging, without the approval of the Lieutenant Governor, for the ship or aircraft to call at a port in the Bailiwick other than a port of entry for the purpose of disembarking passengers, if any of the passengers on board may not enter the Bailiwick of Guernsey without leave, or for the purpose of embarking passengers, unless the owners or agents have reasonable cause to believe all of them to be British citizens.

An owner or agent who contravenes the provisions of paragraph 26 commits an offence under section 27 of the Act.

This Order will come into force on the 7th June, 2025.
