**The Tobacco Products (Licences and Approvals)
(Guernsey) (Amendment) Regulations, 2025**

THE COMMITTEE FOR HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 4(2)(a), 10(2)(a), 16(2), 19(2)(a) and 51 of the Tobacco Products (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2014^a and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:-

Amendment of Regulations of 2014.

1. (1) The Tobacco Products (Licences and Approvals) (Guernsey) Regulations, 2014^b ("**the principal Regulations**") are amended as follows.

(2) In regulation 4 of the principal Regulations -

(a) in paragraph (1)(b), immediately after "address", insert "(or in the case of mobile premises, proposed location)", and

(b) immediately after paragraph (2), insert the following paragraph -

"(3) In paragraph (1)(b), the reference to "location" in relation to mobile premises is a reference to -

(a) the location where those premises are normally kept when not in use, and

(b) the locations where those premises will be stationed when used for the sale of tobacco products."

(3) For the Schedule to the principal Regulations, substitute the schedule in the Schedule to these Regulations.

Transitional.

2. (1) This regulation applies to the following -

(a) an application of a kind for which a fee is prescribed in the principal Regulations,

(b) an application for a duplicate licence.

(2) Where an application falling within paragraph (1)(a) is made before the commencement of these Regulations ("**commencement**"), the fee payable for the application is the applicable fee prescribed in the principal Regulations as they had effect before commencement, whether or not the application is determined after commencement.

(3) Where an application falling within paragraph (1)(b) is made before commencement, the fee payable for the issue of the duplicate licence is the applicable fee prescribed in the principal Regulations as they had effect before commencement, whether or not that duplicate licence is issued after commencement.

Citation.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Tobacco Products (Licences and Approvals) (Guernsey) (Amendment) Regulations, 2025.

Commencement.

4. These Regulations shall come into force on the 31st March, 2026.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Tobacco Products (Licences and Approvals) (Guernsey) Regulations, 2014 to provide for the proposed locations of mobile premises to be kept on the register of licences and to prescribe new fees for licences and approvals under the Tobacco Products (Guernsey) Ordinance, 2014.

These Regulations will come into force on the 31st March, 2026.
